**Special Abbreviations:**

5dc Shell: 5 dc in same st (est in row 1).
FLO = Front Loops only

Begin Shawl:

Ch 326

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, (ch 5, sk 3 chs, sc in next st) twice, sk 1 ch, 5 dc in next st, sk 1 ch, sc in next st, *(ch 5, sk 3 chs, sc in next st) 3 times, sk 1 ch, 5 dc in next st, sk 1 ch, sc in next st*, rep *to* across to last 8 sts, (ch 5, sk 3 ch, sc in next st) twice, turn.

Row 2: *(Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop) twice, 5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of next 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc, 1 sc in next ch-5 loop*, rep * to * across, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in 1st st, sk ch 2 sp, *ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, 5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc in 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5 loop*, rep * to * across, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in 1st st, *sc in next ch-5 loop, 5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc*, rep * to * across, sc in next ch-5 loop, 3 dc in last sc, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in 1st st, *5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, (ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop) twice, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell*, rep * to * across, 5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd ch of ch 3 tch, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, 2 dc in 1st st, *sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5 loop, (ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop) twice, 5 dc in next sc*, rep * to * across, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, 3 dc in last sc, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in 1st st, *ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of next 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, 5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of next 5dc shell* rep * to * across, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of ch 3 tch, turn.

Row 8: *Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, 5 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5 loop, 5 dc in next dc, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell*, rep * to * across, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in 1st st, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of next 5dc shell, *5 dc in next sc, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell, (ch 5, sc in next ch-5 loop) twice**, ch 5, sc in 3rd dc of 5dc shell*, rep * to * across, ending last rep at **, turn.

Rows 10-57: Repeat row 2-9, 7 times, turn.

Edging:

Row 2a is worked in the front loops only (FLO), Row 2b is worked in the rem back loop of the same sts. The two are functions of the same row. Row 3 is the joining row: sc through all four loops of rows 2a and 2b tog.

Row 1: Ch 1, 3 sc in same st, sc in each center DC of shell st. across to last st, 3 sc in last st, on short side, work 97 sc (1 sc on edge of each sc and 2 sc on edge of dc), work 3 sc in 1st ch of foundation ch, sc in each chain across to last ch, 3 sc in last ch, on opposite short side, work 97 sc (as est in pat), join with sl st to 1st sc. Fasten off. (852)

Row 2a: In any corner, attach yarn with sl st in FLO, ch 1, 3 hdc FLO in sm st, hdc FLO across to corner, 3 hdc FLO in corner, cont in est pat, join with sl st to 1st hdc, Fasten off. Turn. (860)

Row 2b: In any corner, attach yarn with sl st in rem lp, ch1, working in rem lp of row 1 sc, 3 hdc in sm st, hdc across to corner, cont as in row 2a.(860)

Rd 3: In any corner, attach yarn with sl st through all lps of rds 2a and 2b, ch 1, sc in same st, sc through all lps around, working 3 sc in each corner. Join with sl st to 1st sc. Fasten off (868).

Weave in all ends and block your shawl to 20"x80".
