# Flower Infinity Scarf

This scarf is easy to crochet. It is started around a D ring which is later covered by a cluster of flowers.

**Special Stitches:**

-3 dc cl--(yo, insert hook in next st, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps) 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook

-V st--(tr, ch 1, tr) in specified st

**Pattern Notes:**

first ch 3 always counts as dc; first ch 4 always counts as tr

**Infinity Wrap:**

**Row 1:** RS work 23 sc loosely over one side of ring. Ch 3, turn.

**Row 2:** sk next st, work 3 dc cl in next st, (ch 1, sk next st, work 3 dc cl in next st) across to last two sts, sk next st, dc in last st. ch 4, turn. 10 cls, 2 dc

**Row 3:** work V st in each cl across, tr in last dc. Ch 4, turn. 10 V sts, 2 trs.

**Row 4:** work V st in each V st across, tr in last tr. Ch 3, turn.

**Row 5:** work 3 dc cl in V st, (ch 1, work 3 dc cl in V st) across, dc in last tr. Ch 4, turn.

Rep Row 3-5 until work measures 50 in., ending last row with ch 1, turn.

**Last Row:** work 15 sc evenly over last row and other side of ring; fasten off.

**-Ruffle:**

With RS facing, ch 1, (sc, hdc, dc, tr) in side of first dc on one side of the ring, [(work 6 tr in side of tr) twice, 4 tr in side of dc] across, ending with tr, dc, hdc, sc in side of last dc; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

**-Edging on other side:**

With RS facing, sc evenly around; join with sl st in first sc, fasten off.

**Flower (make 4):**

**Rnd 1:** ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, work (ch 3, 2 tr, ch 3, sl st in ring) 5 times, join with sl st in first ch; fasten off, leaving long end for sewing. 5 petals

**Finishing:**

Sew flowers to ring. Weave in all ends. If desired, mist
