Rachel's Herringbone Pillow Case

Knit this pretty herringbone textured pillow as a weekend project with our soft super bulky yarn. Four functional buttons add addition color and interest. The pillow is a perfect match for Rachel's Paneled Afghan (shown in background). Why not make both?

CO 33 st(s) with Crochet Cast-on or your preferred cast-on method.

Pillow Body

Pattern:

1. (RS) [k2,p2] twice, k1, p2, k2, p2, *k3, p2, k2, p2, k1, p2, k2, p2; rep from * to last 2 st(s), k2
2. p1, *k2, p2, k2, p3, k2, p2, k2, p1; rep from * to end
3. k1, *p1, k2, p2, k5, p2, k2, p1, k1; rep from * to end
4. p3, k2, p2, k1, p1, k1, p2, k2, *p5, k2, p2, k1, p1, k1, p2, k2; rep from * to last 3 st(s), p3

Repeat this pattern until the panel measures approx. 13 inches. Next knit the RS and purl the WS until the panel measures 26 inches.

Top Buttonhole Flap

On the RS rows p1, knit 31, p1 across and on the WS rows k1, purl 31, k1 across for approx. 1.5 inches.

Next row: p1, k3, BO 3, k4, BO 3, k5, BO 3, k4, BO 3, k3, p1

Next row: k1, p3, CO 3, p4, CO 3, p5, CO 3, p4, CO 3, p3, k1

Next row: p1, k31, p1

*k across

*bind off kwise

Finishing

Match the sides (not including the top flap) and mattress stitch them together.

Next sew on the buttons matching with the button holes you created.

Sew in all loose strands.

Put the pillow form inside the pillow, button and enjoy your new cozy pillow.
