Perfection Super Bulky Popcorn Pillow

Unique Home Decor pieces are all the rage. This pillow cover, designed for an 18" pillow form, will showcase your handiwork and is very simple to make. It works up incredibly quick on Super Bulky yarn, and with a button-closing flap, the cover can be removed and washed.



Super Bulky Popcorn Pillow

Popcorn (pc): 3 dc in indicated st, draw up a lp, remove hook, insert hook in first dc of 3-dc group, pick up dropped loop and draw through st on hook

Work in rows. (turn at the end of every row)

Row 1: ch 37, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (36 sc)

Rows 2 – 22: ch1, sc in every st across row.

Row 23: ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in next 2 sts, * pc, dc in next 4 sts; repeat from * across, end with pc, dc in last 2 sts.

Row 24-26: ch 1, sc in every st across row.

Row 27: ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in next 5 st, *pc, dc in next 4 sts, repeat from * 5 more times.

Row 28-30: ch 1, sc in every st

Repeat rows 23-30 twice more.

Repeat rows 23-26 to finish popcorn side of pillow.

This completes the second side of the pillow. Fold in half and add single crochet evenly spaced along the edge to join each of the two sides. Leave the top open, and continue from popcorn side to make flap.

Flap:

Row 1-7: ch 3, dc in each st across main side of pillow (bobble side)

Row 8: ch 3, * dc in each of next 5 sts, dec dc in next 2 st; repeat from * across (30 dc)

Row 9: ch 1, sc in 5 st, ch 6, sc in same st again *sc in next 10 st, ch 6, sc in same st again; repeat from * sc in last 5 st.

The 3 groups of chains in the last row make the button holes. The ch 6 will make an average size button hole. Adjust the number that you chain if you want to use a larger or smaller button.
