Café Cowl

This project uses the “coffee bean pattern” found in an old knitting book from 1934 and adapted to a cozy cowl that is worked in the round on circular needles. Wear this as an accompaniment to the cafe stole or alone over your favorite coat or sweater.

Abbreviations...

- **k3tog** = knit three stitches together (two stitch decreased)
- **k2tog** = knit two stitches together (one stitch decreased)
- **yo** = yarn over

Seed Stitch Pattern

Row 1: [K1, P1] repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 2: Purl the knit stitches and knit the purl stitches to end of round.

Coffee Bean Pattern

Row 1: [yo, k3, yo, k3tog]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 2: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 3: [k2tog, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 4: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 5: [yo, k3tog, yo, k3]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 6: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 7: [yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, k2tog]; repeat between [] to end of round

Row 8: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Start Cowl Pattern: Cast on 90 sts.

Place marker and join in the round being careful not to twist the stitches.

Work in seed stitch pattern 3 times (6 rounds).

Work the eight round coffee bean pattern 4 times (32 rounds).

Work in seed stitch pattern 22 times (44 rounds).

Bind off in pattern and weave in ends.

Hand wash and block before wearing.
