YARN

Kraemer Yarns Alpaca Handknitting Chunky Yarn

(70% Alpaca / 30% Merino Wool)



2 skeins (Sample shown n color Rose Gray)

GAUGE

11 sts = 4" in seed stitch pattern

Knitting Needles: Size US #10.5 / 6.5 mm 24" circular (or size needed to obtain gauge)

> *Notions:* 1 Stitch Marker

Measurements:
Height = approx.
15 ½"
Approx. 33"
in circumference



This project uses the "coffee bean pattern" found in an old knitting book from 1934 and adapted to a cozy cowl that is worked in the round on circular needles. Wear this as an accompaniment to the cafe stole or alone over your favorite coat or sweater.



Abbreviations...

- k3tog = knit three stitches together (two stitch decreased)
- **k2tog** = knit two stitches together (one stitch decreased)
- yo = yarn over

Seed Stitch Pattern

Row 1: [K1, P1] repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 2: Purl the knit stitches and knit the purl stitches to end of round.

Coffee Bean Pattern

Row 1: [yo, k3, yo, k3tog]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 2: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 3: [k2tog, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 4: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 5: [yo, k3tog, yo, k3]; repeat between [] to end of round.

Row 6: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Row 7: [yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, k2tog]; repeat between [] to end of round

Row 8: Knit all stitches to end of round.

Start Cowl Pattern: Cast on 90 sts.

Place marker and join in the round being careful not to twist the stitches.

Work in seed stitch pattern 3 times (6 rounds).

Work the eight round coffee bean pattern 4 times (32 rounds).

Work in seed stitch pattern 22 times (44 rounds).

Bind off in pattern and weave in ends.

Hand wash and block before wearing.

COMMONLY USED KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS

left hand BO CC CN CO bind off make one (increase 1 stitch) slip 1, slip1, knit 2 slipped stitches together ssk contrasting color MC stockinette (stocking) stitch (1 row K, 1 row P) main color purl cable needle st(s) stitch(es) p2sso pass 2 slipped stitches over through back of loop cast on, cast off cont continue . P2tog purl 2 stitches together (1 stitch decreased) together dec(s) decrease(s)/decreasing patt rep(s) pattern repeat(s) wrong side patt(s) PM dpn double-pointed needles pattern(s) with yarn in back every other row place marker with varn in front eor yarn over g st garter stitch (K every row) psso pass slipped stitch over yarn over needle purlwise inc(s) increase(s)/increasing knit rem remain(ing) repeat instructions in parantheses number of times K1, s1, psso knit one, slip one, pass slipped stitch over indicated rep repeat right hand repeat instructions following asterisk as indicated or knit 2 together rnd(s) K2tog tbl knit 2 together through back loop round(s) until end of row [] instructions in square brackets refer to larger sizes knitwise riaht side
