Mission Furrows Jacket

Be ready for the cold weather with our gorgeous knitted jacket.
This garment boasts tons of texture and displays a great back
view with diagonal furrows meeting down the middle.

A pleasant knitting experience with our
100% Wool (Merino blend) yarn,



Note: Continue in pattern as given when working increases and decreases.

Back:

- With smaller needles CO 108 (114, 120, 126, 132, 138, 144, 150), work in ribbing by repeating rows 1 & 2 of chart for 2"
- Row 1 – Change to larger needles and starting with row 3 of chart, work across 54 (57, 60, 63, 66, 69, 72, 75)sts, repeating sts between red vertical lines to center, PM (*Marker indicates center back*), work to end of row, again repeating sts between red vertical lines as necessary.
- Row 2 – work row 4 of chart
- Continue working chart through row 14, then repeat chart from Row 3 to 14 until work measures 13 ½ (14, 14 ½, 15, 15, 15 ½, 16, 16)" ending with a WS row.

Armholes:

- Keeping in pattern, BO 6 (6, 6, 6, 6, 6, 7, 7) sts at beginning of next 2 rows (fastening a marker towards the middle of this row will help in measuring the depth of the armhole later)
- At beginning of next 2 rows BO 4 sts
- Dec 1 sts each end of needle every RS row 4 (5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 8, 9) times
- There will remain 80 (84, 88, 94, 100, 104, 106, 110) sts
- Continue even until armholes measure 8 ½ (9, 9 ½, 9 ¾, 10, 10 ¼, 10 ½, 10 ¾)" ending with a WS row.

Shape Shoulders:

- At beginning of next 2 row BO 7 (8, 8, 9, 10, 10, 10, 11) sts
- At the beginning of the following two rows BO 7 (7, 8, 9, 10, 10, 10, 10) sts
- At the beginning of the following two rows BO 7 (7, 8, 9, 9, 10, 9, 10)sts
- BO remaining 38 (40, 40, 40, 42, 44, 48, 48) back sts

Fronts :

- Work both fronts at the same time from two separate skeins of yarn.
- With smaller needles cast on 54 (57, 60, 63, 66, 69, 72, 75) sts for left front. With a separate skein of yarn Cast on 54 (57, 60, 63, 66, 69, 72, 75) sts for right front
- Work in ribbing by repeating rows 1 & 2 of chart for 2" being careful not to connect fronts by working each side from its own skein of yarn. (*I find it helpful to pin the fronts together so I always know what the center fronts are*)
- Change to larger needles and work in pattern, working left front from column 1 (4, 1, 4, 1, 4, 1, 4) to the center line of chart and right front from the center line to the end).
- Work as for back until armholes are reached.
- Continue armhole shaping as for back but at the same time dec 1 st at neck edge (using K2tog at end of left front and ssk at beginning of right front) every RS row 18 (18, 18, 17, 19, 20, 24, 23) times.
- Then dec 1 st at neck edge every 4 rows (if # is 0, omit these rows) 1 (2, 2, 3, 2, 2, 0, 1) times
- There will remain 21 (22, 24, 27, 29, 30, 29, 31) sts
- Work even until armhole measures same as for back to shoulder. Shape shoulder as for back until you run out of sts.
- BO

Set in Sleeves:

- With smaller needles, CO 46 (46, 50, 50, 50, 54, 54, 56) sts
- Work in ribbing by repeating rows 1 & 2 of chart for 2 ½" starting at column 2 for sizes 36 & 38, column 4 for sizes 46 & 48, column 2 for size 50. For sizes 40, 42, & 44, K2 then continue from column 1 and end with K2.
- Place a maker after st 23 (23, 25, 25, 25, 27, 27, 28) to indicate the center making chart reading easier



- Change to larger needles and work in pattern repeating rows 3-14 of chart, starting at column 2 for sizes 36 & 38, column 4 for sizes 46 & 48, column 2 for size 50. For sizes 40, 42, & 44, K2 then continue from column 1 and end with K2.
- Increase 1 st at each end of needle every 4 rows 8 (12, 14, 16, 18, 17, 20, 20) times
- Then inc 1 st at each end of needle every 6 rows 8 (6, 5, 4, 3, 4, 2, 2) times, there should be 78 (82, 88, 90, 92, 96, 98, 100) sts on your needles
- Work even in pattern if necessary until work measures 16 (16 $\frac{1}{2}$, 16 $\frac{3}{4}$, 17, 17 $\frac{1}{2}$, 17 $\frac{3}{4}$, 18 $\frac{1}{4}$, 18 $\frac{3}{4}$):

Shape Sleeve Cap:

- At beginning of next 2 rows BO 5 (5, 5, 5, 5, 5, 6) sts
- At beginning of the following 2 rows BO 3 sts
- Dec 1 st each end of needle every RS row 3 (4, 5, 5, 5, 6, 7, 8) times – There should remain 56 (58, 62, 64, 66, 68, 68, 66) sts
- Dec 2 st each end of needle every 4 rows 0 (0, 0, 0, 0, 4, 4, 2) times (if # is zero, omit these rows)
- Then dec 1 st each end of needle every RS row 9 (8, 9, 9, 10, 1, 3, 4) times
- Then BO 2 sts at beg of next 4 (6, 6, 6, 6, 0, 0, 0) rows (if # is zero, omit these rows)
- Then BO 3 sts at beg of next 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 12, 10, 10) rows (there should remain 18 (18, 20, 22, 22, 22, 24, 24) sts
- BO

Repeat for second sleeve

Front Button Band:

- With RS facing on left front for females and right front for males and using smaller needles, pick up and K 3sts for every 4 rows along front edge adjust, if necessary to end with a multiple of two.
- Work in K1, P1 ribbing until band measures 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
- BO all sts in pattern
- Mark placement for desired # of buttons (we used 5), one $\frac{1}{2}$ " from bottom edge, one at edge of v-neck and the others evenly space between.

Front Button Hole Band:

- On right front for females and left front for males and using smaller needles, pick up and K 3sts for every 4 rows along front edge, adjust if necessary to end with a multiple of two.
- Work in P1, K1 ribbing and work as for button band working one row of buttonholes opposite markers when work measures $\frac{1}{2}$ " work buttonhole row.
- To make buttonhole, *work to 1 st before placement mkr, BO 3 sts, repeat from * until all buttonholes are worked, work to end of row
- On next row use a 3 st e-loop cast-on over each buttonhole.
- Continue ribbing until buttonhole band measures same as button band.


Sew fronts to back at shoulder seams

Collar:

- With RS facing pick up and K 7 sts for every 8 rows along right front from front band to shoulder seam, place marker, pick up 1 st for every bound off stitch around back of neck, place marker, and pick up 7 sts for every 8 rows along left front v-neck to edge of band. (Make sure the # of sts from shoulder to front band is the same on both sides.)
- Work in K1, P1 ribbing to the shoulder and across the back to the other shoulder, turn, YO right hand needle, continue in ribbing to other shoulder, turn.
- YO right hand needle, continue in established ribbing to YO, work the YO together with next st., work 1 more st. Repeat last row until portion between markers is $\frac{3}{4}$ inch long. On next row, increase 10 sts evenly between markers. (Rib pattern will change between markers after this row but will remain same on rest of collar) Repeat last row until all sts have been worked.
- BO loosely in pattern.

Assembly:

- Sew sleeve caps to armholes
- Sew sleeve seams and side seams
- Sew on buttons
