

Caribbean Cover-up

Show off your sun-kissed skin in this light cover up, with it's lovely flowing drape. Spend the sultry days of summer leisurely pool side or relaxing on the beach. You will look and feel like you are in a tropical paradise.



Special Abbreviations:

Beg V st: (Ch 4, dc) in same st.

V st: (Dc, ch 1, dc) in same st.

Designer notes:

- This is an adaption of “Irish Waves Sweater” by Kristen Stoltzjus.
- Cover-up is worked on RS in one piece and is fit as you go.
- Cover-up is worked in the round, which also forms cap sleeves.
- An extra skein of yarn may be needed for larger sizes.

Begin Cover-up: Using Color A

Body: Begin at center of back, with size G hook, ch 6, join with sl st to form ring.

Continue with Color A

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc throughout), work 17 dc in ring; join. (18 dc).

Rnd 2: Work beg V st in same st as join. sk next dc, (work V st, sk next dc) repeat from * around; join. (9 V st).

Cut A

Using Color B

Rnd 3: Join in top of last join, sl st in sp of next V st, work beg V st, ch 1, *(V st in ch 1 of V st, ch 1) repeat from * around; join. (9 V st, 9 ch 1 sps).

Rnd 4: Sl st in sp of next V st, work beg V st, ch 3, *(V st in ch 1 of V st, ch 3) repeat from * around; join. (9 V st, 9 ch 3 sps).

Rnd 5: Sl st in sp of next V st, work beg V st, ch 5, *(V st in ch 1 of V st, ch 5) repeat from * around; join. (9 V st, 9 ch 5 sps).

Cut B

Using Color C

Rnd 6: Join in top of last join, ch 3, *(3 dc in sps of V st, dc in next dc, 5 dc in ch 5 sp, dc) repeat from * around; join. (90 dc).

Rnd 7: Rep Rnd 2 (45 V sts).

Rnd 8: Sl st in sp of next V st, work beg V st, ch 1, *(V st in V st, ch 1) repeat from * around; join

Rnd 9-10: Rep Rnd 8.

Cut C

Using Color A

Rnd 11: Join in top of last join, ch 3, dc in each dc and ch st around; join (180 dc).

Rnd 12: Sl st in next st, work beg V st, sk next 2 dc, *(V st in next dc, sk next 2 dc) repeat from * around; join (60 V sts).

Rnd 13: Sl st in sp of next V st, sc in same sp, ch 4, *(sc in next V st, ch 4) repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc (60 lps).

Rnd 14: Sl st into center of ch lp, sc in same lp, ch 4, *(sc in next ch lp, ch 4) repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 15-17: Rep Rnd 14.

Cut A

Using Color B

(*From this point on continue changing colors in established order.)

Rnd 18: Join in top of last join, sl st into next ch lp, ch 3 (Place marker in 3rd ch for top of cover-up), work 3 dc in same lp, *(4 dc in next ch lp) repeat from * around; join & place marker at halfway point for bottom.

- *continue to move markers up as you work your rounds, you should have an equal number of stitches on each side.*

Rnd 19: Sl st in next st, work beg V st, sk next 2 dc, *(V st in next dc, sk next 2 dc) repeat from * around; join.

Rnd 20: Sl st in sp of next V st, work beg V st, ch 1, *(V st in V st, ch 1) repeat from * around; join.

Rnd 21 & 22: Rep Rnd 20

Rep Rnds 11 -22 : Check fit of cover-up as you proceed. You should have the same amount of stitches on both sides of markers.

Check Fit of cover-up: To check fit, place top marker at the base of your neck. Bring edges of both sides to the front of shoulder and under the arm, also bring both sides to the back of shoulder and under the arm. When the width of circle meets comfortably under your arms, you are ready to create sleeve opening. You might want another set of hands to help you with this part. End on Rnd 11 or 18.

On both sides, use st markers to mark where the front and the back meet under the arm. Count sts between markers for sleeve openings, making sure they are an even number of sts and the same quantity on each side. The bottom sts, or waist edge, should be an even number of sts.

Sleeves Shaping Rnd: Work beg V st, *(sk next dc, V st in next dc) repeat from * around to marker, [work V st in st marked, sk over the sleeve sts between the markers to form sleeve], rep between ()'s around to next marker, rep between []'s, rep between ()'s to complete rnd and join.


* **Note:** The point where the sleeves comes together is actually at the front of the cover-up, not the armpit. this will become more clear as you add rounds.



Cover-up Front: Cont Body Rnds 11-22 until circle is approx 4" from original sleeve opening, ending on a ch 4 lp rnd or V st rnd.

- **Note:** You are alternating between Ch 4 lp rnds and V st rnds, make sure you continue in that order as you work the bottom section of the cover-up.

Put cover-up on. Place a marker on each side of the waist, at the hip bone. You will now be working in rows between the markers for the bottom of the cover-up. Make sure you have the same number of stitches between the top marker and the 2 sides. The bottom sts between the markers should equal the number of stitches as one of the sides (see diagram below).



Holding garment upside down with RS facing, join yarn at side marker 1.

(You will now be working in rows)

Continue in pattern that was established in rounds 11-22, but see changes below to make them rows, turning work when you reach side marker 2.

*** for V rows:**

Turn, sl st to center of V, work beg V then continue in pattern.

*** for ch 4 rows:**

Turn, ch 4, sc in center of 1st ch 4, then continue in pattern.

*** for dc row:**

Turn, ch 3 counts as first dc, then continue in pattern.

Continue in pattern until skirt measures 11" (*or desired length*) from the beginning of where you started working in rows. Ending on a ch-4 lp row. Skirt will flare out as you go along.



Edging:

Change to next color in sequence.

This following section should consist of a multiple of 4 sts.

Holding garment upside down with RS facing sl st in first ch 4 lp (this will become a corner) ch 3, 3 dc in same sp.

From this point on, you will be working in the round *(4 dc in next ch lp repeat from * around, when you come to last stitch on the bottom; 4 dc, ch 1, 4 dc (*to create corner*)).

Continue to dc evenly up the side, around the neck and down the other side. When you come to the last st on the side: 4 dc, ch 1, (*to create corner*); join in 3rd ch of ch 3.

Sl st in next st, work beg V st, sk next 2 dc, (V st in next dc, sk next 2 dc) around making one V stitch in both of the ch 1 sps at the corners; join



Sl st in sp of next V st, sc in same sp, ch 4, (sc in next V st, ch 4) around; join with sl st in first sc.

work 5 sc in each ch 4 sp around.

Sleeves:

Rnd 1: Join yarn in any st of the sleeve opening (use the same color as sleeve opening throughout), sc evenly around edge with a multiple of 4 st. Join with sl st in first sc.

work Rnd 12 - 17 once.

work 5 sc in each ch 4 sp around; Join

Work second sleeve same as the first using the same number of stitches

Weave in ends and enjoy!
